STUDENT ASSISTANCE

If your school is closed or is closing, or if the educational program you are enrolled in is being discontinued, the Office of Student Assistance and Relief (OSAR) will help you navigate your financial and academic future; help you identify, obtain, complete and submit financial relief documents; and explore transfer and teach-out opportunities.

You may be eligible to:

- ➡ File a loan discharge claim with the U.S. Department of Education.
- → Access refunds from the state's Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF).
- → Transfer your completed units to another school.
- ⇒ Participate in an approved teach-out plan.

RESEARCHING COLLEGE

Researching and applying to colleges may seem intimidating if you don't know where to start. However, with some proper guidance and the right resources, this process can be much easier than you think.

OSAR offers resources to help you:

- ⇒ Discover your educational style.
- ⇒ Enroll in a private college in California.
